Our church will ordain our two newest deacons: Marshall and Bridget Ivey. Join us for this worship service. A reception will follow in the fellowship hall.

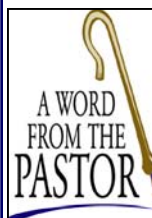

September Sermon Series
Mending Broken Hearts
Encouragement from the Psalms



Here in Georgia, there is a small town named Warm Springs named after the soothing warm waters of the mineral rich springs which bubbles up out of the earth keeping the water at a temperature of 88 degrees year round. This small town gained national recognition when U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt went there to receive treatment for his polio related paralysis.

In biblical times, the region of Gilead was quite famous for the medicinal balms that were found there. Tucked in the story of Joseph being sold into slavery by his brothers in Genesis 37 are the traders from a caravan who traveled from Gilead with their camels loaded down with spices, balm, and myrrh. This healing ointment was much sought after for its curative powers. In an address by the prophet Jeremiah he asks a rhetorical question: *Is there no balm in Gilead? Is there no physician there? Why then is there no healing for the wound of my people?* Jeremiah insists that God can heal the wounds of his people. However, it is absolutely necessary for those wishing to be healed to take the medicine which brings healing. The medicine that brings healing according to the prophet is obedience, to live life God's way.

This month we will be talking about healing the wounds of the heart. All of us have experienced these "wounds of the heart": others have hurt us, we have hurt others, and we have been hurt by the loss of something or someone important to us. Over the next few weeks a study of selected Psalms will remind us that God wants to bring healing to our hearts. Come join us.

Dear church family,
 Daniel Webster Whittle wrote the words to *There Shall be Showers of Blessing*. Whittle lost his right arm during the American Civil War and spent time in a prisoner of war camp. While in this camp he found a New Testament and came to know Christ personally. Once released from prison, he worked in Chicago at the Elgin Watch Company where he met and worked with Phillip Bliss and James McGranahan. Bliss and McGranahan were both musical evangelists who worked with Dwight L. Moody.

James McGranahan wrote the hymn's melody. McGranahan had a gifted tenor voice and desperately wanted a career in opera. In 1876, Phillip Bliss had written to McGranahan urging him to reconsider using his voice for the Lord rather than pursuing an opera career. Bliss had explained what a joy it was to see people come to know the Lord while McGranahan was singing.

Shortly after, McGranahan received news that a close friend had died in a train wreck. When he went to the train wreck he met Daniel W. Whittle. On the ride home, James McGranahan conversed with the Almighty and began to serve as a singing evangelist. Their partnership gave us *There Shall be Showers of Blessing*.

How can our gifts be used if we, too, surrender ourselves to God's calling?

May God continue to bless us all.

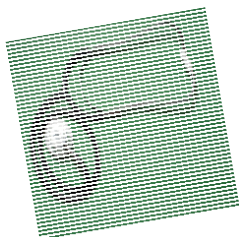
