



Dear church family,

For the months of June and July, as we've done these past several years, our Summer Choir will be leading us musically in worship. We'll sing hymns we grew up singing. There is no Wednesday night rehearsal for this choir. We meet at 10:15 in the choir room on Sundays and rehearse for just a few minutes before our worship service begins. We would love to have you sing with us!

Knowles Shaw (1834-1878) was a preacher, singer, and composer. In his day he was one of the best known figures in the American Restoration Movement. Shaw was an exceptional singer by all accounts, and integrated hymns into his sermons as a natural extension of his message, as was the practice of the great evangelistic teams of the day.

*Bringing in the Sheaves* was written in 1874, and was dedicated to the memory of Augustus Damon Fillmore (1823-1870), a fellow preacher and songwriter. For some reason this hymn has taken hold of the popular imagination as the go-to cultural reference for American "old-time religion." It has appeared in a lengthy list of movies and television episodes, and it seems they were singing this hymn every time the Ingalls family went to church on *Little House on the Prairie*.

*Sowing in the sunshine, sowing in the shadows, Fearing neither clouds nor winter's chilling breeze; By and by the harvest and the labor ended, We shall come rejoicing, bringing in the sheaves.*




School is winding down and HBC Kidz are getting geared up for the summer!! We have many fun activities to look forward to this month and throughout the summer!
